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State of the Program

2019-2020's program was aimed towards creating a map of partners around Israel, for EMID guest artists to be a part of in their performances, masterclasses and community outreach through Internal Compass Music.

As you can imagine, 2020 brought great difficulties to everyone, but nevertheless under the circumstances we found ways to stay creative and maintain a program for Internal Compass students and audiences for guest artists.

Main Achievements

As stated above, 2020 was a challenging year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. During the first lockdown and due to both the restrictions and cuts in funding the possibility of closing down the project became very real. Thanks to a strong team of teachers and students we were able to move our program completely online.

The second semester of the program forced us to think and work differently. As a result, both our students, teachers and international artists mastered home recording and remote musical collaboration.
